• WHY ATTACK COMELEC CREDIBILITY?

- Losers need to justify their loss, without losing face
- Candidates need to pre-emptively save face
- Candidates resort to siege mentality to create a bandwagon
- As a form of distraction and misdirection
- Cynicisim, hate

CREDIBILITY UNDER ATTACK

HOW IS COMELEC CREDIBILITY ATTACKED?

- Promote fear of the unknown
- Conduct a long-term, low-intensity de-legitimization campaign
 - Incl. coordinated inauthentic behavior
 - Incl. use of celebrity mouthpieces
- Amplify COMELEC's own mistakes



WHO IS ATTACKING COMELEC CREDIBILITY?

- People who lose in elections
- People who claim to be motivated by altruism
- People who dislike (or even hate) COMELEC
- People who do it for money
- COMELEC itself, with its missteps



- KEY STRATEGIES (T.R.A.P.) 1/
 - Transparency
 - Misinformation thrives in the absence of reliable, accurate, and relevant information
 - Regular press briefings
 - #PalawanPleb delivery of ballots to Kalayaan were delayed
 - Live stream of key COMELEC activities
 - Incl. public biddings

FIGHTING BACK

- · KEY STRATEGIES (T.R.A.P.) 2/
 - Reporting
 - Not allowing misleading information to go unchallenged
 - Using the reporting systems provided by socmed platforms
 - Acknowledge, assess, correct
 - We admit mistakes yes, the 2016 \tilde{n} debacle was due to ...
 - We commit to correction yes, in 2019 we tightened things up...
 - We follow-through For 2022, we fine-tuned the process by ...



- KEY STRATEGIES (T.R.A.P.) 3/
 - Persistent repository of information
 - Deflates blowhards
 - Allows uniform and consistent, system-wide messaging
 - Encourages public participation and ownership AskCOMELEC Facebook Group



YES

- · In 2016
 - Pulse Asia results
 - 84% trusted the election results
 - 94% said the vote-counting machines were easy to use
 - 91%, want automated voting in future elections
 - "[Voters] feel that faster results made the elections more credible and it's also easier..." said Pulse Asia President Dr. Ronnie Holmes.
 - Social Weather Stations (SWS) results

An average of 86% of voters said the election results are believable

80% were satisfied with the conduct of the election

ARE OUR ELECTIONS CREDIBLE?

YES

- In 2019
 - Pulse Asia results
 - 91% said they "would like to see automated voting continue in future elections"
 - 87% said they "were satisfied with the automated polling system or counting of votes through the vote counting machine (VCM)"
 - 94% said it was "easy to vote using the VCM"
 - 94% said the May 2019 elections in their areas was "orderly"
 - 64% said "there was no vote-buying" in their areas
 - 74% said "no cheating occurred" in their areas
 - 93% said "no violence occurred"



- LESSONS FROM THE AMERICAN 2020 EXPERIENCE
 - Losers follow a universal playbook
 - Perpetuating a "big lie" can have effects that cross-over from the realm of rhetoric to real world actions that threaten the stability of government and, worse, human lives

Where are the allies of truth?

 - Journalists play a big role
 - Academics play a big role
 - Ordinary people with social media platforms play a role
 - Not just as watchdogs looking out for irregularities in government, but also as watchdogs that actively fight against disinformation
 - Silence is not a lack of bias; silence is complicity
